Filmed entirely in and around Utica, Gabriel Kahane's deeply personal feature debut chronicles a lawbreaking teenager (Justin Mark) forced to work at a wig shop for cancer patients owned by the warm-hearted Susan (Catherine Curtin), where he befriends a guarded woman (Holly Heiser) who alters his life. It's a film that gives an honest peek into the often bleak (albeit exceedingly human) existence of Benji, his drug-addicted, alcoholic mother, absentee father, and the others in his orbit. The Outrun is a poignant drama based on Amy Liptrot's acclaimed memoir, exploring themes of addiction, recovery, and the healing power of nature. The story follows Rona (Saoirse Ronan), a young woman who returns to the remote Orkney Islands after a decade in London, seeking peace and renewal following a battle with alcoholism. Immersed in the rugged landscapes of her childhood, she confronts her troubled past and finds solace in the untamed beauty of the islands. The film weaves an intimate narrative of self-discovery, resilience, and hope.

Nightbitch is a black comedy/horror film based on Rachel Yoder's 2021 novel. The story follows a former artist, now a stay-at-home mother (Amy Adams), who becomes convinced she's transforming

into a dog, symbolizing her struggle with the constraints of motherhood and loss of personal identity. As her physical changes intensify, she grapples with her new reality, leading to darkly comedic and surreal experiences. The film premiered at the Toronto International Film Festival where critics lauded Amy Adams for "one of the wildest, most ambitious performances of her career."
